GREEN CAMPUSES






The AUM and ACM campuses were designed as a simulation of how we would like the world to be; more inclusive and with open spaces, trees, green areas, and zero-emission vehicles. The campuses comprise more than 750 palm trees and a large area of forest and planted vegetation.

AUM SUSTAINS ITS POSITION AS THE GREENEST AND MOST SUSTAINABLE UNIVERSITY IN KUWAIT

For the second consecutive year, AUM has been ranked as the number 1 green university in Kuwait, 23rd across universities in the Arab countries, and 268th globally by UI GreenMetric World University Rankings 2021. Compared to the previous year, AUM advanced 34 positions in the global ranking, while sustaining its position as the most sustainable university in Kuwait.

UI GreenMetric World University Rankings is one of the most credible sources related to university rankings on sustainability and its rising popularity made it reach universities participating from 80 different countries in 2021. The indicators that universities are evaluated on are Setting and Infrastructure, Energy and Climate Change, Waste, Water, Transportation, and Education. This year's theme focused on Universities and their achievement of the UN Sustainable Development Goals in all aspects while reflecting on their efforts in response to the pandemic.



WASTE MANAGEMENT



RECYCLING

AUM and ACM collaborate with local organizations to handle recyclable materials and maximize efforts to reduce and manage various kinds of wastes.

Until today, the university has achieved major progress towards achieving this objective:

- Setting up a designated location on campus for waste collection, sorting and pickup in addition to a designated location for e-waste
- Training of housekeeping staff to deal with segregations
- Digital transformation through e-forms, LCD Screens and responsible printing to reduce papers
- Instilling waste management and recycling mindset in students' projects, activities, and online events

UPCYCLING

AUM launched an upcycling workshop series as part of its efforts to teach students about waste management, recycling, and responsible consumption. The first series of workshops was titled "Plastic to Plant" and comprised two sessions on the first week of December and another two sessions on the second week of the same month so both groups of students can attend while taking all the necessary health and safety precautions.

GHG AND GREEN GAS EMISSION RECYCLING PROGRAMS



HumanSoft is conducting efforts to reduce its carbon emissions by tracking and analyzing the carbon footprint of its subsidiaries. The current GHG emission reduction programs implemented fall under scopes 2 and 3.

In scope 2, efforts to reduce purchased electricity and energy costs are undergoing with the use of energy-efficient appliances, cloud computing, and IT systems with lower energy consumption. As for scope 3, two main emission sources are considered in the reduction programs: waste management and commuting.



Zero-emission and electric shuttles are available for journeys within the campuses and there are designated tracks for pedestrians, runners, cyclists, and zero-emission vehicles. Furthermore, common transportation is available for a group of staff members and some faculty and staff members carpool together.








AUM students were present at the event in their dedicated booth where they interacted with visitors and showcased student graduation projects related to sustainable development and alternative and renewable energy. An example of projects displayed include Wifibot lane detection algorithm, long-range communication with drone, small solar cars, balloon-based small satellites network for secure communication, bionic arm for amputee cases, and super Anthony fighter robot.



AUM participated as a main sponsor in the first Kuwait Electric Road Show that took place at Murooj on December 2, 3, and 4. Titled "Green Kuwait", the main purpose behind the event is to support cleaner energy and reduce carbon emissions by spreading awareness about the new electric and hybrid vehicles available in Kuwait.

AWARENESS ON ENVIRONMENT RELATED CAUSES

AUM organizes events and activities to raise awareness on the environment and other sustainable development challenges that the planet is facing. During campus closure that came as a result of the pandemic, the initiatives did not stop and were moved online. Some of the events that were organized in an online format are listed hereunder.



WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY

On the occasion of World Environment Day, AUM organized a competition among students and alumni to encourage them to think in a more environmentally friendly way and come up with creative solutions that can make the campus more sustainable. Certification of participation and plants were distributed to all participants, in addition to prizes to the top three winners.

WORLD WATER DAY

AUM organized an event on World Water Day (WWD). The event started by giving an overview about WWD, the challenges that the planet is facing concerning water, this year's theme, which is Valuing Water, and by discussing the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) especially SDG6 - Clean Water and Sanitation. The event also included trivia questions and an art competition that students submitted a week earlier.

The university has identified eight research themes that are aligned with sustainable development and global changes. In 2021, the number of publications related to sustainability exceeded 200, with an increase of 100 publications compared to the previous year.

AUM YOUTH





As a result of the lockdown caused by the pandemic, AUM created a website targeting "Youth" to motivate them to stay active during the pandemic. Through the AUM Youth website, the university organized virtual event and competitions related to Sports and fitness, among other activities that fall under arts, science, and innovation. Some of the athletic online events done are Core, Body Combat, Circuit Training, Full Body Workout, Fitness and Nutrition, Upper and lower body workout, abs, and fitness challenges.

EMPOWERING AUM AND ACM COMMUNITIES THROUGH ATHLETICS EVEN DURING THE PANDEMIC

AUM has a large Sports Center complex that provides the AUM and ACM communities free access to a wide range of indoor and outdoor sporting facilities located on campus. As a result of the pandemic, the sports Center adapted by organizing online initiatives among which are the launching of AUM online coaching platform, get fit with the champs, virtual walkathons, and online campaigns. Once the health situation started to cool down, the Sports Center started welcoming students, faculty, and staff through an online booking system.

Indoor Sports Facilities are divided into both male and female sections, with three separate floors that divide faculty from students with each having their respective spacious fitness suite with a full range of state-of-the-art cardiovascular equipment, fixed resistance machines, and free weights.

The Gym hosts five large multi-purpose rooms; fitting up to 30 individuals, that can cater to martial arts, yoga, studio cycling, and floor-based exercises including dancing and gymnastics.



Outdoor Sports Facilities include a football stadium, volleyball and basketball courts, and a tennis court. The football stadium extends on an area of 6,500m2.

The bleachers grant more than 2,500 sports fans, an excellent location to cheer for their playing teams.

The Olympic track surrounding the field encompasses four lanes in 400m of length. The playground hosts annual marathons and football games.

Sports Teams are also available at AUM and ACM for males and females, which include football, basketball, volleyball, squash, table tennis, futsal, swimming, and tennis. Professional trainers at the gym and specialized coaches for different kinds of sports are also present dedicating their time to prepare students physically and mentally to perform their best and prepare for competitions.



CLINICAL SERVICES



AUM Central Clinic includes two large clinics that can accommodate a big number of patients on a daily basis. Each clinic has a registered nurse selected from the ER department of one of the most renowned hospitals in Kuwait. The nurses are well trained and have a solid experience in handling medical cases and emergencies. In addition to having the best medical equipment and continuously monitoring the medicines' validity, AUM ensures having the highest standards of cleanliness in its central clinic.

Services Offered at the Clinic

Simple Cases

General check-up for students and staff whenever they visit the clinic with any complaints such as blood pressure, diabetes, dizziness, etc.

Provide them with medicine when applicable such as painkillers, pills for sore throat, etc.

In case of accident or emergency

- Provide first aid when applicable
- Host the student/staff until the ambulance arrives, if necessary





CAMPUS ACCESSIBILITY

Accessible flat routes and passenger zones across all the boundaries of the campus

Flat routes and passenger zones exist in the main entrance gates and parking to the other side of the campus. In addition to the flat routes at the ground level, we note that a flat passage exists within all the main buildings blocks (Business Administration Building, Engineering Building, Cultural Center Building...)

Curb ramps for Wheelchair passage allowing access to all buildings and facilities

Ramps are installed near the entrances of all buildings and also inside the buildings.

Designated bathrooms for people with disability are available on all building floors

including Sports Center where the trainers offer alternative exercise to people with special needs.



Elevators existing in all the buildings:

At least three elevators are installed in each of the entrances of the buildings (each building has more than one entrance). All elevator buttons have accessible heights.



Available shuttle service and support:

More than 10 shuttle environment-friendly cars are available on campus.



Designated parking spaces near all buildings entrance/exit available to people with reduced mobility.

HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES FOR STUDENTS RETURN TO CAMPUS



SPECIAL NEEDS SERVICES

Any student with special needs or health condition that restrict them academically or physically is required to file a request form at the student affairs department and provide an official document that details their case in order to effectively serve and support the student.

The Admission Committee meets with each special needs student to evaluate the medical condition and identify the services that could be provided for the student. Afterward, tailor-made support is offered according to each student's needs.



After 19 months, AUM and ACM started welcoming students back to campus. To ensure a safe and smooth entry, big efforts were conducted such as establishment of health checkpoints at all entrance gates, dedicating isolation rooms, sanitizing all areas, rethinking seating arrangements, spreading continuous awareness regarding safety precautions, and dedicating a COVID-19 support line.

DEDICATED ACADEMIC SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS WITH LEARNING DISABILITIES

Students who suffer from learning disabilities are offered one-to-one tutoring sessions at the Tutoring Center to accommodate their unique learning needs and help them improve their academic performance. The Counseling Unit supports students with learning disabilities by ensuring that they learn academic skills that improve their performance.

The campus security team is on duty 24/7 to ensure on-campus safety and security.

Security is an essential part of life on campus that is why all special events, renovations, plans for new facilities and the daily operations on campus are always evaluated for safety impact.

In addition to having CCTV Security Cameras, Firefighting Systems, Access Control System, and security personnel present on campus, the University and College have an evacuation plan during emergencies that all internal stakeholders are familiar with.

GCC TRAFFIC WEEK



On the occasion of GCC Traffic Week, AUM raised awareness about road safety through an online session. Students who had first-hand painful experiences from accidents shared their stories with the students.

DIABETES AWARENESS AT AUM AND ACM



On the occasion of World Diabetes Day, AUM and ACM ran a series of separate activities to raise awareness about the disease and encourage healthy living among the campus community. From nutrition and exercise to medical care and advice about handling complications, students benefited from the opportunity to learn more about diabetes and healthy diet from experts across the country.





BREAST CANCER AWARENESS AT AUM AND ACM

2021 marked the sixth Pink October at AUM and ACM and both events come at a time when the latest statistics show that the number of breast cancer cases in Kuwait comprise the highest number across all types of cancer. Mammogram vouchers were distributed to all female students, faculty, and staff who passed by the booths. In addition to having the AUM community wear pink ribbons, interactive games such as arts and crafts were conducted at the booths so that students can demonstrate their creativity while creating more awareness about breast cancer.

AUM ONLINE COACHING AND TRAINING PLATFORM

In early 2021, AUM launched its "Online Coaching and Training" platform, which contains about 100 workout videos. The online transition of the AUM Sports Center is part of the university's commitment to making sure that all its centers and services are still functioning properly to provide students with a holistic learning experience and for them to fully benefit from the university resources even during the COVID-19 pandemic.

5 Stars in Inclusiveness and Internationalization in the QS Ratings



AUM is the only university in Kuwait to ever achieve an overall exemplary rating of 5 stars in the QS Stars Rating System, which is considered one of the most influential and credible ratings for universities globally. In addition to the overall 5 Stars rating, AUM was awarded 5 stars in Inclusiveness, Internationalization, and four other criteria: Teaching, Academic development, Employability, and Online learning.

DIVERSE COMMUNITY

HumanSoft maintained a diverse community by having faculty and staff from more than 70 countries and over 60% female students. It is also noting that the Chairperson of the Board of Directors at HumanSoft is a female.



FIESTA BY THE LAKE

As part of a series of events to introduce students to different cultures and celebrate diversity, AUM organized Mexican-themed events titled "Fiesta by the Lake." The events took place near the lake area inside AUM campus and included a series of engaging activities among which are mystery games, photo booths, Mexican live performances, and arts and crafts. The talented student, Israa Al Shemari, customized sombreros by drawing and writing students' names on them.

HULT PRIZE

The Hult Prize is a worldwide student competition that challenges university teams to solve the most pressing global ideas. The aim of the competition was to find an innovative way to make good out of food whether it is by changing the way we produce food or the way we dispose of food. AUM students had a chance to synthesize biodiesel in AUM labs and find tangible results. Four teams from the College of Engineering and Technology participated in the competition and one graduation project group (5 senior students and a faculty) in Chemical Engineering Department competed with more than 30 teams from different countries around the world. AUM Chemical Engineering team has advanced as regional finalists.



A PIECE OF HOPE: AN ARABIC LITERATURE COMPETITION BY AUM

AUM launched an online competition in Arabic literature under the title "A Piece of Hope", with the aim of encouraging its students to develop their talents in Arabic poetry and share it with the audience. 

RESEARCH FUNDING & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT



RESEARCH is a core component of AUM and ACM educational philosophies and faculty professional development. Both, the university and college, provide support for the research and professional development activities of their PhD and Masters holders through funding:

VIRTUAL CAREER FAIR



2021 marked the seventh career fair at AUM and was held in a virtual and dynamic environment as a safety precaution because of the COVID19 pandemic. More than 8,000 AUM students and alumni participated in the virtual career fair where they engaged with top local and international employers, who were offering around 1,500 job opportunities, through the different technological tools offered by the virtual platform, among which are chat rooms, teleconferencing, webcasts, webinars, and one-to-one interviews.



SOFT SKILLS

Soft Skills E-courses platform provides AUM and ACM students, faculty, and staff the opportunity to engage in self-paced e-courses that will upgrade their skills. Through the partnership with Softskills, HumanSoft community is offered an exclusive access to over 7,000 soft skills world-class video courses.



ONGOING ONLINE SERVICES FOR STUDENTS AND ALUMNI AT AUM AND ACM

During campus closure, the Tutoring Center at AUM, which provides free academic support, started offering its services online. Moreover, student advising was not interrupted during this period and was being offered online through the Academic Advancement Center (AAC).
